

Professor Ian Lauder FMedSci

Professor Lauder, FRCPath, FMedSci, studied at the University of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, where he went on to become a Lecturer in Pathology from 1970-78. He became Senior Lecturer in Pathology at the University of Leeds, and then, in 1984, Professor of Pathology at the University of Leicester. In 2002 he became Dean of the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Warwick, and was Dean of the Faculty of Medicine and Biological Sciences at Leicester in 2003. He was Dean of the Leicester Warwick Medical Schools until 2007.

Between 1990-95 Professor Lauder was Chairman of the Advisory Committee on the Assessment of Laboratory Standards at the Department of Health, and from 2000 he has been a Non-Executive Director of the University Hospitals of Leicester NHS Trust. In 2003 he became Chairman of the Armed Services Consultants Appointments Board in Pathology and since 2000 he has been Treasurer of the Council of Heads of Medical Schools. He was a member of the GMC in 2002 and 2003, and was Secretary of the British Lymphoma Pathology Group between 1980-90. With the Royal College of Pathologists he was Chairman of the Speciality Advisory Committee between 1990-93, and Vice-President from 1996-99. He has published widely on malignant lymphomas, cancer pathology and quality assurance in pathology.
